



Maintenance of Certification

Since ABVP's inception, we have required maintenance of certification every ten years. Before you officially start the submission process, please take a moment to review the MOC Handbook. MOC points can now be uploaded at any time! It is STRONGLY recommended that it be done throughout the year for each year of the 10-year cycle.

Diplomate Requirements

All ABVP Diplomates are required to maintain certification every 10 years.



- You are responsible for knowing your MOC date.
- MOC is mandated by the AVMA American Board of Veterinary Specialties for all RVSOs.
- Extensions will not be granted for claims of lack of notification.

 Cardiology, Neurology.






Deadline: July

- If your certification expires
 12/31/25, ALL material (points
 applications) must be uploaded
 by July 15th of that year.
 - Your RVS MOC Vice Chairs review all applications.
 - Once all approved, submit renewal form.
 - The MOC Chairperson will review all final renewal applications.







Retiring? Emeritus Status!

- Are you an Active Diplomate in good standing?
- 2. Are you still earning income which depends upon or is enhanced through ABVP certification in the species for which Emeritus status is requested?

Failed to MOC?

If the Diplomate has not fulfilled the requirements by year 10:

- Diplomate status will expire on 12/31 of that year.
- Diplomate title must be removed immediately from all marketing and business materials by 12/31.
- There is no Time-Stamped
 Certification. e.g. Pat Smith, DABVP
 (Feline 2010-2020) is not allowed.
- See handbook for recertification process.

Maintain is the Key

- MOC is an ongoing process.
- MOC Vice Chairs review points applications ongoing basis.
- All material is due July 15th of the year your certification expires.





4 Requirements Every 10 Years

- I. Continuing Education: 250 hours
- 2. Additional Points: 250 points
- 3. Journal Club: 40 quizzes
- 4. License



Transition Points

- Due to new MOC rules implemented 2020
- Already applied for those needing to MOC between 2020 & 2029





1 year extension

- Already applied (once)
- Accounts for the 1 year "pause" to implement the new system.





MOC Transition Chart

Due to recent changes in the MOC process, if you were originally certified or completed maintenance of certification between 2010 and 2019, this MOC chart determines the pro-rated number of points in each of the three categories that are needed based on your certification date.

NOTE: Transition Points have ALREADY been applied to your account.

Continuing Education

- 1 CE Hour = 1 point
- Does not need to be
 RACE-approved
- 165 of 250 hours (66%) in RVS
- Cross-Species Track counts
 as RVS



Additional Points

- ABVP Volunteerism NEW and EXPANDED
- ABVP Symposium attendance
- Publication in peer-reviewed journals
- Lectures given
- Additional Continuing Education (2 points/1 CE hour)
- Successfully mentored ABVP applicant NEW
- Second specialty board certification
- Passing the exam (points only)







Journal Club

- 6 per year in odd months
- 40 of the 60 (66%) over ten years
- Each available for 1 year
- Email sent out to notify of new JC
- Access articles via the link after member login
- Screenshot proof of passing grade





Renewal Application

- Start once all individual applications for points have been approved
- Upload copy of license
- Pay MOC fee
- Submit
- Final review



Timing

- Year 9 or 10
- Once complete, wait for next cycle to begin to start uploading again.


